AUXCHEF CLASS

The first AUXCHEF class held at CG Sector Long Island Sound was on 3 & 4 November and saw three new chefs successfully pass the PQS. They are John Delemarre, Gary McGuire and Timothy Mulherin.

It was a 20-hour class which was comprised of classroom lessons and discussion, practical experience in the galley and a written exam. Graduates must have recently completed an 8-hour TCT, required every two years, received a Hepatitis A vaccine, and received blanket orders for operations and administrative duties within the district before they can work in a USCG galley or on a vessel.

Assignments will vary between Sector, the USCG Academy and CG Station New London depending on the needs of each location.

REPORTS

- **DCDR** Reminder on Leadership Conference; flotilla elections. See page 6 for information on a division Change of Watch, storm damage to facilities and a Hurricane App.
- **CM** AUXNET was activated on 28 October in preparation for Hurricane Sandy. The Coms trailer was made available if needed during the storm.
- CS The problem of uploading to the division website has finally been resolved. The division website has been brought up to date and changes have been made to the Safety Notices page in order to list the latest warnings. The News page announces the Auxiliary's partnership with Wind check magazine. The latest issue of Boat Basin is also available on line now.
- IS All data input has been entered and approved as received. There is one open issue concerning "missions over 24 hours."
- **MA** Orders were placed for office supplies and received.
- **PE** A special workshop was scheduled for 17 Nov; PEOs were required to attend.

 the Stratford Waterfront and Harbor

 effort of leading and coordinating the
 Housatonic River Dredging project, Bill
 Rock can report that dredging has now
 begun. He scheduled a press conference for
 13 November to include CT DEEP, DOT,
 US Army Corps of Engineers and US Coast
 Guard at the Outriggers in Stratford to further explain the project and arrange for
 press tours of the ACOE dredger Currituck.

Flotilla publicized PE courses where applicable. FL 24-8 participated in the Hammonasset Jamboree on 6 October with a Sea Partners/Boating Safety Booth.

Milford — 10 facilities all current; last patrol was done by Stratford on 29 July.


Guilford — 21 facilities all current; last patrol was 3 September and 4 November

DIVISION C-O-W



HURRICANE APP

A possible useful tool for flotillas to use to account for their members after any natural or man-made disaster is the Red Cross Hurricane App. It can be found in the App Store and is free to download. By pressing on the little toolbox icon on the top of the screen, the person can click the "I'm safe" button to let it be known that the he/she is safe. It can be shared via text, Twitter, Facebook or email.

The Flotilla Commander should designate someone or a couple of people to receive these "I'm safe" messages via text or email. Ask members to check in with this message within a certain time frame after the event.

HURRICANE DAMAGE

Kim Filion Division Commander has been asked to put together a list of damages to members' facilities such as boats, planes, radios, PPE, cars, whatever. If it is used to support the Coast Guard and it is damaged beyond repair or repair costs are meaningful, it should be listed with DCDR. The following information should be provided: name, EMPLID, item and approximate value. Our District Commodore-elect believes that flotilla bases count for this purpose.

Hurricane Sandy brought high water to the Connecticutt shoreline.


These are scenes in Clinton.
