Ted Alwine, FSO-VE. received a handful of awards and certificates at the February meeting. Carl Duford, FC, made the presentations: a certificate for appointment as FSO-VE: a certificate for passing the Administrative Procedures Course; an award for most RBS visits. 3rd place in the Division: and two certificates of appreciation, one from the Flotilla and one from Division. Alwine also has

passed his Navigation Rules exam and is beginning study for Coxswain.

Meet the Staff Officers

FSO-PE: The Flotilla Staff Officer of Public Education will exercise staff responsibility and supervision over all matters pertaining to the Auxiliary's public education program, on the Flotilla level, including the scheduling, organization and conduct of Flotilla boating safety courses and activities.

Robert Shivokevich has taken over as FSO-PE for 2012. Besides being an Auxiliary member, he's also an instructor and past commander of the Champlain Power Squadron.



"With the start of a new year, the Flotilla needs to start thinking about how we offer our basic boating course, About Boating Safely (ABS)" says Shivokevich.

"This is an 8-hour course that can be done in one day and then tested. However, I believe this is not a good method. The course also can be offered in two days, four hours each and then tested on the second day; or over two to three consecutive weeks.

"I find that the more time you have in contact with the students, the better are the chances of recruitment. With shorter classes, the students have more time to get to know us, ask questions about the Flotilla or boating in general.

"How we do this all depends on the instructors, who is available and how many we have. We cannot expect one or two instructors to teach all the classes.

"When we schedule our classes, we need to be aware of others who are also teaching a safe boating course, such as the Clinton County Sheriff's Department or the U.S. Power Squadron which is offering a sixweek course at Clinton Community College. We should avoid scheduling on those dates.

"So my goals for the upcoming year, as your Public Education Officer, is to have at least four to five boating courses offered; introduce some new programs; and to have enough new instructors."

Currently, Shivokevich is organizing an ABS class for 14-15 March at the South Plattsburgh Fire Department, and there are three new instructors waiting for certification.

Many of us have been following the story of LightSquared, a company that plans to develop a wholesale 4G LTE wireless broadband communications network integrated with satellite coverage across the United States. The concern is that this plan will interfere with GPS navigation signals used by aircraft, the military, ships and boaters, cars, farmers, etc. On Jan. 13, a federal committee investigating this issue reported that LightSquared's plan will not work.
